### IDIOMS

What is an idiom?

An idiom is a sequence of words which has a different meaning as a group from the meaning it would have if you understood each word separately. Idioms add colour to the language, help us to emphasise meaning and make the language lively and interesting.

#### IDIOMS WITH COLOURS
